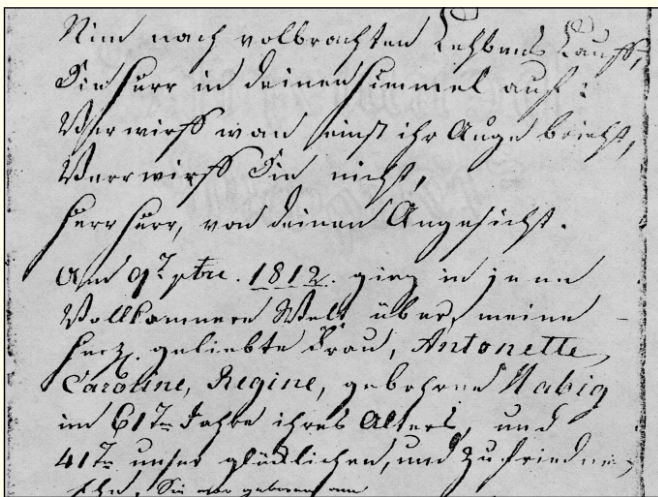


North Carolina Family Records Online: Linking Our Pasts

Tell your family's story by donating your
Bible records. It's as easy as 1, 2, 3!



The NC State Archives and the State Library of NC have partnered to create *North Carolina Family Records Online*. The digital collection contains over 700 Bible records (birth, marriage, and death information written in family Bibles), and is comprised from the 2000+ donated North Carolina family Bibles held by the Archives. New Bible records are added often.

The Library's six-volume *Marriage and Death Notices*—indexes of marriage and death announcements appearing in five NC newspapers from 1799 to 1893—rounds out this collection.

1. If your family Bible:

- contains at least one person who has lived in or was born in North Carolina, and
- contains at least one birth or death dating to 1913 or earlier . . .

. . . it qualifies for inclusion in our collections! *Continue to #2.*

2. Make a scan or photocopy of the Bible's

- title page and copyright page
- all pages that contain family records info (births, deaths, marriages, etc.)
- If possible, type all handwritten text, so we don't spell your family's names wrong!
